## KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

**MANHATTAN, Kan. August 11, 2025** - For the week ending August 10, 2025, there were 5.9 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 6% very short, 20% short, 64% adequate, and 10% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 8% very short, 22% short, 62% adequate, and 8% surplus.

**Field Crops Report:** Corn condition rated 3% very poor, 9% poor, 27% fair, 42% good, and 19% excellent. Corn silking was 90%, behind 95% last year, and near 93% for the five-year average. Dough was 68%, behind 77% last year, but near 66% average. Dented was 22%, behind 29% last year, but near 21% average.

Soybean condition rated 1% very poor, 5% poor, 25% fair, 57% good, and 12% excellent. Soybeans blooming was 79%, behind 85% last year and 84% average. Setting pods was 54%, equal to last year, and near 56% average.

Sorghum condition rated 2% very poor, 7% poor, 27% fair, 45% good, and 19% excellent. Sorghum headed was 55%, behind 68% last year, and near 59% average. Coloring was 15%, near 19% last year and 11% average.

Cotton condition rated 0% very poor, 9% poor, 43% fair, 34% good, and 14% excellent. Cotton setting bolls was 73%, behind 82% last year, but near 71% average. Bolls opening was 2%, behind 7% last year, and near 5% average.

**Pasture and Range Report:** Pasture and range conditions rated 4% very poor, 9% poor, 24% fair, 52% good, and 11% excellent.
