## KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

**MANHATTAN, Kan. August 25, 2025** - For the week ending August 24, 2025, there were 6.3 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 6% very short, 24% short, 65% adequate, and 5% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 8% very short, 27% short, 62% adequate, and 3% surplus.

**Field Crops Report:** Corn condition rated 4% very poor, 10% poor, 27% fair, 43% good, and 16% excellent. Corn dough was 89%, near 91% last year and 87% for the five-year average. Dented was 56%, behind 62% last year, and near 57% average. Mature was 12%, behind 18% last year, and near 13% average.

Soybean condition rated 1% very poor, 7% poor, 26% fair, 55% good, and 11% excellent. Soybeans blooming was 92%, near 93% both last year and average. Setting pods was 78%, near 77% both last year and average. Dropping leaves was 1%, near 2% last year and 3% average.

Sorghum condition rated 4% very poor, 9% poor, 29% fair, 45% good, and 13% excellent. Sorghum headed was 85%, near 87% last year and 84% average. Coloring was 30%, behind 37% last year, and near 31% average. Mature was 6%, near 5% last year and 2% average.

Cotton condition rated 0% very poor, 6% poor, 31% fair, 42% good, and 21% excellent. Cotton setting bolls was 96%, near 95% last year, and ahead of 89% average. Bolls opening was 13%, near 17% last year and 15% average.

**Pasture and Range Report:** Pasture and range conditions rated 4% very poor, 10% poor, 25% fair, 52% good, and 9% excellent.
