## KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

**MANHATTAN, Kan. September 29, 2025** - For the week ending September 28, 2025, there were 5.0 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 4% very short, 14% short, 70% adequate, and 12% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 6% very short, 18% short, 66% adequate, and 10% surplus.

**Field Crops Report:** Winter wheat planted was 17%, behind 30% for both last year and the five-year average. Emerged was 5%, near 9% both last year and average.

Corn condition rated 5% very poor, 9% poor, 26% fair, 43% good, and 17% excellent. Corn mature was 87%, near 91% last year and 85% average. Harvested was 29%, well behind 51% last year, and behind 42% average.

Soybean condition rated 2% very poor, 7% poor, 26% fair, 54% good, and 11% excellent. Soybeans dropping leaves was 57%, behind 70% last year and 67% average. Harvested was 5%, behind 10% last year and 12% average.

Sorghum condition rated 4% very poor, 7% poor, 26% fair, 44% good, and 19% excellent. Sorghum coloring was 91%, near 94% last year and 93% average. Mature was 48%, behind 58% last year, and near 52% average. Harvested was 7%, behind 16% last year and 12% average.

Cotton condition rated 1% very poor, 16% poor, 33% fair, 36% good, and 14% excellent. Cotton bolls opening was 26%, well behind 79% last year and 70% average.

Sunflowers harvested was 6%, near 10% last year and 7% average.

**Pasture and Range Report:** Pasture and range conditions rated 4% very poor, 8% poor, 26% fair, 51% good, and 11% excellent.
