KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. March 16, 2026 - For the week ending March 15, 2026, there were 5.5 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 14% very short, 34% short, 47% adequate, and 5% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 15% very short, 33% short, 49% adequate, and 3% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 5% very poor, 11% poor, 32% fair, 44% good, and 8% excellent.
