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KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. March 23, 2026 - For the week ending March 22, 2026, there were 6.4 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 20% very short, 40% short, 37% adequate, and 3% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 15% very short, 39% short, 43% adequate, and 3% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 6% very poor, 13% poor, 35% fair, 39% good, and 7% excellent. Winter wheat jointed was 6%, near 3% last year and 2% for the five-year average.
