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KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. April 27, 2026 - For the week ending April 26, 2026, there were 5.6 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 28% very short, 31% short, 34% adequate, and 7% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 24% very short, 36% short, 37% adequate, and 3% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 16% very poor, 25% poor, 36% fair, 21% good, and 2% excellent. Winter wheat jointed was 86%, ahead of 76% last year and 67% for the five-year average. Headed was 43%, well ahead of 17% last year and 11% average.

Corn planted was 29%, behind 37% last year, and near 30% average. Emerged was 11%, near 10% last year and 8% average.

Soybeans planted was 15%, near 12% last year, and ahead of 8% average.

Sorghum planted was 4%, near 3% last year and 1% average.

Cotton planted was 3%, near 1% average.
