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KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. June 29, 2026 - For the week ending June 28, 2026, there were 2.6 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 4% very short, 10% short, 58% adequate, and 28% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 7% very short, 14% short, 65% adequate, and 14% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat mature was 98%, ahead of 91% last year and 86% for the five-year average. Harvested was 72%, well ahead of 48% last year and 52% average.

Corn condition rated 3% very poor, 6% poor, 25% fair, 52% good, and 14% excellent. Corn silking was 24%, near 20% last year, and ahead of 15% average.

Soybean condition rated 2% very poor, 6% poor, 24% fair, 59% good, and 9% excellent. Soybeans planted was 92%, near 89% last year and 94% average. Emerged was 85%, near 81% last year, and equal to average. Blooming was 12%, near 11% last year and 9% average.

Sorghum condition rated 2% very poor, 4% poor, 34% fair, 46% good, and 14% excellent. Sorghum planted was 86%, near 88% last year and 89% average. Headed was 5%, near 1% last year and 2% average.

Cotton condition rated 5% very poor, 16% poor, 53% fair, 24% good, and 2% excellent. Cotton squaring was 36%, well ahead of 11% last year, and ahead of 31% average. Setting bolls was 2%, near 1% both last year and average.

Sunflowers planted was 72%, behind 82% last year and 84% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 5% very poor, 12% poor, 27% fair, 45% good, and 11% excellent.
