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KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. July 13, 2026 - For the week ending July 12, 2026, there were 5.5 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 3% very short, 19% short, 64% adequate, and 14% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 6% very short, 21% short, 63% adequate, and 10% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat harvested was 97%, ahead of 91% last year and 87% for the five-year average.

Corn condition rated 4% very poor, 7% poor, 25% fair, 46% good, and 18% excellent. Corn silking was 50%, near 49% last year, and ahead of 45% average. Dough was 16%, ahead of 10% last year and 8% average.

Soybean condition rated 1% very poor, 7% poor, 23% fair, 57% good, and 12% excellent. Soybeans emerged was 95%, ahead of 90% last year, and equal to average. Blooming was 37%, equal to last year, and near 34% average. Setting pods was 12%, ahead of 5% last year and 6% average.

Sorghum condition rated 2% very poor, 7% poor, 40% fair, 35% good, and 16% excellent. Sorghum planted was 97%, near 96% last year, and equal to average. Headed was 17%, ahead of 5% last year and 8% average.

Cotton condition rated 4% very poor, 10% poor, 46% fair, 32% good, and 8% excellent. Cotton squaring was 75%, well ahead of 43% last year, and ahead of 62% average. Setting bolls was 9%, near 6% last year and 11% average.

Sunflowers planted was 85%, behind 96% last year and 94% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 4% very poor, 10% poor, 29% fair, 45% good, and 12% excellent.
