Mississippi Crop Progress and Condition Report

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Week Ending April 16, 2017

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 6.4 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, April 16, 2017. Topsoil moisture supplies were 4 percent very short, 18 percent short, 71 percent adequate, and 7 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 5 percent very short, 18 percent short, 70 percent adequate, and 7 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 50.7 degrees Fahrenheit at Winona to 66.2 degrees Fahrenheit at Biloxi. Highs ranged from 76.3 degrees Fahrenheit at Biloxi to 85.0 degrees Fahrenheit at Columbus. Most of the state received little rain, with the highest concentration in the southeast part of the state with an average of 0.30 inches.
