Week Ending: April 1, 2018 Released: April 2, 2018

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 3.3 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, April 1, 2018. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 3 percent short, 62 percent adequate, and 35 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 1 percent very short, 3 percent short, 65 percent adequate, and 31 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 47.3 degrees Fahrenheit at Ashland to 62.1 degrees Fahrenheit at Vicksburg City. Highs ranged from 62.0 degrees Fahrenheit at Corinth to 79.7 degrees Fahrenheit at Columbia. Most of the State received some rain, with the highest concentration in the north central part of the State with an average of 2.92 inches.


