According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 2.9 days suitable for fieldwork for the **week ending Sunday, November 25, 2018**. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 1 percent short, 51 percent adequate, and 48 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 8 percent short, 54 percent adequate, and 38 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 32.5 degrees Fahrenheit at Philadelphia to 47.7 degrees Fahrenheit at Biloxi. Highs ranged from 56.8 degrees Fahrenheit at Moorhead to 72.0 degrees Fahrenheit at Hattiesburg. Most of the State received light rain, with the highest concentration in the south central part of the State with an average of 0.59 inch.
