Mississippi Crop Progress and Condition

Week Ending: March 31, 2019

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 4.8 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, March 31, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 8 percent short, 55 percent adequate, and 37 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 11 percent short, 56 percent adequate, and 33 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 38.5 degrees Fahrenheit at Philadelphia to 53.6 degrees Fahrenheit at Biloxi. Highs ranged from 62.8 degrees Fahrenheit at Macon to 78.1 degrees Fahrenheit at Laurel. Mild to moderate precipitation was received throughout the State, with the highest concentration in the lower delta part of the State with an average of 1.44 inches.
