According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 1.1 days suitable for fieldwork for the **week ending Sunday, April 21, 2019**. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 2 percent short, 45 percent adequate, and 53 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 4 percent short, 45 percent adequate, and 51 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 40.7 degrees Fahrenheit at Winona to 54.7 degrees Fahrenheit at Biloxi. Highs ranged from 64.5 degrees Fahrenheit at Kosciusko to 77.3 degrees Fahrenheit at Hattiesburg. Moderate to heavy precipitation was received throughout the State, with the highest concentration in the south central part of the State with an average of 4.12 inches.
