Week Ending: June 9, 2019 Released: June 10, 2019

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 4.4 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, June 9, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 19 percent short, 68 percent adequate, and 13 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 12 percent short, 74 percent adequate, and 14 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 60.2 degrees Fahrenheit at Newton to 74.1 degrees Fahrenheit at Biloxi. Highs ranged from 78.8 degrees Fahrenheit at Newton to 94.5 degrees Fahrenheit at Poplarville. Light to moderate precipitation was received throughout the State, with the highest concentration in the east central part of the State with an average of 3.41 inches.
