Week Ending: June 23, 2019 Released: June 24, 2019

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 5.1 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, June 23, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 1 percent very short, 20 percent short, 64 percent adequate, and 15 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 14 percent short, 67 percent adequate, and 19 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 67.2 degrees Fahrenheit at Crystal Springs to 78.7 degrees Fahrenheit at Biloxi. Highs ranged from 86.6 degrees Fahrenheit at Independence to 92.9 degrees Fahrenheit at Laurel. Light to moderate precipitation was received throughout the State, with the highest concentration in the coastal part of the State with an average of 2.80 inches.
