Week Ending: July 7, 2019 Released: July 8, 2019

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 5.2 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, July 7, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 1 percent very short, 18 percent short, 68 percent adequate, and 13 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 1 percent very short, 16 percent short, 66 percent adequate, and 17 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 68.4 degrees Fahrenheit at Winona to 77.2 degrees Fahrenheit at Biloxi. Highs ranged from 88.0 degrees Fahrenheit at Independence to 96.1 degrees Fahrenheit at Laurel. Light precipitation was received throughout the State, with the highest concentration in the northeast part of the State with an average of 0.65 inch.

"Irrigation has been almost nonexistent so far for this growing season. Insect pressure is picking up in spots, but still not too heavy. Side-dressed fertilizer has gone out as weather permits. Hay harvest has been slow so far this year."
