According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 6.8 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, September 29, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 30 percent very short, 52 percent short, 18 percent adequate, and 0 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 25 percent very short, 54 percent short, 21 percent adequate, and 0 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 63.7 degrees Fahrenheit at Winona to 72.8 degrees Fahrenheit at Biloxi. Highs ranged from 87.0 degrees Fahrenheit at Saucier to 96.8 degrees Fahrenheit at Columbus. Sparse precipitation was received throughout the State, with the highest concentration in the central part of the State with an average of 0.53 inch.
