# Mississippi Crop Progress and Condition

Week Ending: October 27, 2019

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 2.9 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, October 27, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 8 percent short, 59 percent adequate, and 33 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 1 percent very short, 11 percent short, 63 percent adequate, and 25 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 41.0 degrees Fahrenheit at Lambert to 60.5 degrees Fahrenheit at Saucier. Highs ranged from 69.3 degrees Fahrenheit at Belzoni to 81.5 degrees Fahrenheit at Saucier. Moderate to heavy precipitation was received throughout the State, with the highest concentration in the south central part of the State with an average of 4.41 inches.
