According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 4.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, June 5, 2022. Topsoil moisture supplies were 1 percent very short, 19 percent short, 71 percent adequate, and 9 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 1 percent very short, 13 percent short, 77 percent adequate, and 9 percent surplus.
