Week Ending: April 13, 2025

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 4.4 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, April 13, 2025. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 6 percent short, 71 percent adequate, and 23 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 1 percent very short, 5 percent short, 69 percent adequate, and 25 percent surplus.

Mississippi Subsoil Moisture Map for the week of March 31 - April 6, 2025

The Soil Moisture Active Passive (SMAP) provides measurements of soil moisture in the root zone as a weekly average, represented by pixels. Each pixel represents 9 by 9 kilometer plot or about 20,000 acres. The SMAP data measures soil moisture in cubic centimeters of water/cubic centimeters of soil.
