NEBRASKA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

LINCOLN, Neb. November 19, 2018 - For the week ending November 18, 2018, there were 5.7 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 0 percent very short, 6 short, 87 adequate, and 7 surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 1 percent very short, 8 short, 86 adequate, and 5 surplus.

Field Crops Report: Corn harvested was 88 percent, near 92 last year, and behind 93 for the five-year average.

Soybeans harvested was 97 percent, near 100 both last year and average.

Winter wheat condition rated 2 percent very poor, 5 poor, 23 fair, 51 good, and 19 excellent.

Sorghum harvested was 91 percent, near 90 last year and 95 average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 1 percent very poor, 3 poor, 18 fair, 70 good, and 8 excellent.

Data for this news release were provided at the county level by USDA Farm Service Agency, UNL Extension Service, and other reporters across the State.
