NEBRASKA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

LINCOLN, Neb. October 26, 2020 - For the week ending October 25, 2020, there were 5.2 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 27% very short, 46% short, 27% adequate, and 0% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 28% very short, 41% short, 30% adequate, and 1% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Corn harvested was 76%, well ahead of 40% last year and 46% for the five-year average.

Soybeans harvested was 97%, ahead of 78% both last year and average.

Winter wheat condition rated 5% very poor, 16% poor, 36% fair, 40% good, and 3% excellent. Winter wheat planted was 98%, near 99% last year, and equal to average. Emerged was 84%, behind 90% last year and 89% average.

Sorghum harvested was 82%, well ahead of 36% last year and 51% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 18% very poor, 22% poor, 27% fair, 32% good, and 1% excellent.
