## NEBRASKA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

**LINCOLN, Neb. January 24, 2022** - For the week ending January 23, 2022, topsoil moisture supplies rated 21% very short, 52% short, 27% adequate, and 0% surplus, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 18% very short, 49% short, 33% adequate, and 0% surplus.

**Field Crops Report:** Winter wheat condition rated 8% very poor, 11% poor, 45% fair, 33% good, and 3% excellent.

The next report is currently scheduled to be issued February 22, 2022 but may change due to the federal holiday on February 21<sup>st</sup>.
