NEBRASKA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

LINCOLN, Neb. March 28, 2022 - For the week ending March 27, 2022, topsoil moisture supplies rated 37% very short, 43% short, 20% adequate, and 0% surplus, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 36% very short, 40% short, 24% adequate, and 0% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 10% very poor, 16% poor, 47% fair, 24% good, and 3% excellent.

Weekly reports will begin April 4th for the 2022 season.

Data for this news release were provided at the county level by USDA Farm Service Agency, UNL Extension Service, and other reporters across the State.
