NEBRASKA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

LINCOLN, Neb. November 28, 2022 - For the week ending November 27, 2022, there were 6.6 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 48% very short, 41% short, 11% adequate, and 0% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 54% very short, 34% short, 12% adequate, and 0% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 16% very poor, 23% poor, 41% fair, 19% good, and 1% excellent.

Livestock Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 50% very poor, 32% poor, 17% fair, 1% good, and 0% excellent.

This is the last weekly Crop Progress and Condition report for the 2022 growing season. We would like to extend our appreciation to the dedicated county FSA and extension staff who supplied the necessary information for these reports. For December through March, we will issue monthly reports. The first monthly report (for week ending January 1) will be issued January 3, 2023. Weekly reports will begin April 3rd for the 2023 season.

Data for this news release were provided at the county level by USDA Farm Service Agency, UNL Extension Service, and other reporters across the State.
