Excellent Week for Field Work: New Jersey had an average of 6.0 days suitable for field work. All sweet corn is emerged and harvesting has begun. The second cutting is half way done. The following crops are being harvested: broccoli, carrots, cucumbers, cabbage, eggplant, garlic, tomatoes, nectarines, peaches, potatoes, spring onion, summer squash, sweet corn, long and Italian beans, herbs, sweet and hot peppers. Crops continue to be monitored for disease.
