**Excellent Week for Field Work:** New Jersey had an average of 7.0 days suitable for field work. All sweet corns are harvesting. The second cutting Hay is almost done.

Following crops are being planted: arugula, beets, basil, broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, cilantro, collards, cucumbers, escarole, endive, green onions, kale, lettuce, leeks, kohlrabi, parsley, radishes, snap beans, spinach, summer dandelion, summer squash, Swiss chard.

Following crops are being harvested: Acorn squash, arugula, beets, basil, cabbage, cilantro, carrots, collards, cucumbers, snap beans, sweet corn, summer dandelion, eggplant, green onions, kale, leeks, okra, parsley, pole lima beans, peppers, summer squash, Swiss chard, tomatoes and white potatoes. Growers continue to scout for disease and apply preventative fungicides for late blight and cucurbit downy mildew.
