The following crops are being planted: arugula, baby arugula, spinach, basil, beets, cilantro, cabbage, collards cucumbers, dill, eggplant, escarole, endive, green onions, kale, leeks, mint, parsley, peppers, pumpkins, radishes, summer dandelion, spinach, summer and winter squash, sweet corn, sweet potatoes, Swiss chard, tomatoes, turnips, and white potatoes. Crops being planted: radishes, green onions, kale and cover crops. Other Field activities: Some irrigation, hay work, livestock condition good, milk production down slightly due to heat stress.
