Alfalfa Hay and other Hay third and fourth cuttings are progressing. Peach harvest is on its way to be done. Soybeans fully podded, coloring & dropping leaves is almost done. Fall crop harvest continues. Harvest continuing on following crops: Acorn and butternut squash, arugula, green beans, lima beans, beets, basil, leaf (red and green) lettuce, romaine lettuce, cabbage, cilantro, carrots, collards, sweet corn, cucumbers, summer dandelion, escarole, endive, eggplant, green onions, kale, leeks, parsley, peppers, radishes, spinach, summer squash, sweet potatoes, Swiss chard, tomatoes, white potatoes, broccoli and cauliflower. Cover crops being planted.
