Good Week for Field Work: New Jersey had an average of 5.5 days suitable for field work. There was light frost in some counties. Apple harvesting is almost done. Corn harvesting for grain is progressing. Alfalfa Hay and other Hay third and fourth cuttings are moving along. Soybeans harvested are 45% done. Following crops are being harvested: cabbages, herbs, late fall green and lettuce. Most or all summer vegetable crop fields are cleaned up.
