

## JERSEY FRESH AVAILABILITY FOR MAY 11, 2015

<b>ARUGULA</b>	Harvest starting in light quantity, with volume picking up each week.
<b>ASPARAGUS</b>	With warm weather, and increasing soil temperatures, the harvest has ramped up quickly. Harvesting very good quality product in good volume.
<b>BABY SPINACH &amp; ARUGULA</b>	Harvesting later this year due to weather which prevented early planting. Very good quality products available in light to fair and quickly increasing volume.
<b>BEETS</b>	Harvesting a light to fair volume of very good quality product.
<b>CILANTRO</b>	Harvesting good quality over-wintered product in fair volume. Spring planted starting to become available.
<b>DANDELIONS</b>	Good quality over-wintered Italian bunched product is available now in fair volume. Spring planted should be available by the end of May.
<b>DILL</b>	Harvest starting in light to fair quantity, w/ volume picking up each week.
<b>ESCAROLE &amp; ENDIVE</b>	Harvesting very good quality products in light to increasing volume.
<b>KALE &amp; COLLARDS</b>	Good quality over-wintered product harvesting in fair to increasing volume. Spring product starting to become available soon.
<b>LEEKS</b>	A fair volume of good quality over-wintered product is available.
<b>LETTUCE</b>	Already harvesting very good quality & fair quantities of Boston, & Red & Green Leaf. Harvesting Romaine in light to quickly increasing volume.
<b>MINT</b>	Very good quality harvesting in light to fair & increasing volume.
<b>PARSLEY</b>	Harvest of good quality over-wintered curly and plain product starting in light to increasing volume. Several weeks for Spring planted product.
<b>RADISHES</b>	Harvesting good quality product in fair to good volume.
<b>SPINACH</b>	A fair to good volume of good quality over-wintered product available. Spring planted starting soon.
<b>SWISS CHARD</b>	Harvest of good quality product already harvesting in light to fair volume.

## JERSEY FRESH FORECAST

<b>BASIL</b>	Likes warmer weather. Should be ready in mid-June.
<b>BLUEBERRIES</b>	Minor quantities of early varieties like Weymouth starting in mid-June. The much more widely planted Duke variety will start 3-4 days with volume available a week later.
<b>CABBAGE</b>	Won't be ready until late May or early June.
<b>PEACHES</b>	Winter was longer & colder than normal, & coupled with a slowly warming Spring. The season will be a bit delayed & start in early to mid-July w/ early PF & Sentry varieties, w/ volume and freestone varieties starting a week later. White peaches start a week after that w/ volume late July.
<b>SQUASH</b>	Should start harvesting field grown zucchini in 3-4 weeks with yellow squash starting a few days later.
<b>STRAWBERRIES</b>	Early harvests of Chandler variety berries are expected to begin next week, while the bulk of the crop will be harvested towards late month & early June, with lower volumes to continue through mid-June.
<b>TURNIPS</b>	Should begin harvesting in early June.
