Good Week for Field Work: New Jersey had an average of 5.5 days suitable for field work. Temperatures are still higher than normal, with daily temperatures in the low 60's across the state and nightly temperatures just slightly below freezing in most areas. Fall harvest continues as fields dry. Combining of corn and soybeans continues as the harvests are concluding. Cover crops are still being planted. Fall vegetables that continue to be harvested include: Romaine lettuce, endive, escarole, leeks, kale, beets, dill, cilantro and parsley. Fall has been good to most farmers. Crops were being harvested timely, and quality and yields were good.
