Excellent Week for Field Work: New Jersey had an average of 6.5 days suitable for field work. Sixteen of seventeen New Jersey weather stations reported precipitation but less than an inch for the week. Flemington reported over two inches of rain. All stations reported near normal temperatures. New Jersey is seeing drought like conditions in northern counties, while most of the southern New Jersey is receiving some precipitation. Corn progress is slightly behind compared to last year, while winter wheat, hay, and soybeans are consistent with last year's progress. Field activities included haymaking and harvesting.
