According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 5.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, October 20, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 18 percent short, 82 percent adequate, and 0 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 10 percent short, 90 percent adequate, and 0 percent surplus. Pasture and range conditions ranged from 0 percent very poor, 0 percent poor, 21 percent fair, 79 percent good, and 0 percent excellent.
