According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 6.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the **week ending Sunday, November 17, 2019**. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 12 percent short, 85 percent adequate, and 3 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 12 percent short, 87 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Pasture and range conditions ranged from 0 percent very poor, 8 percent poor, 11 percent fair, 80 percent good, and 1 percent excellent.
