According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 7 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday; May 31st, 2020. Topsoil moisture supplies were 9 percent short, and 91 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supplies were 6 percent short, 89 percent adequate, and 5 percent surplus. Pasture conditions were 3 percent fair, 93 percent good and 4 percent excellent.
