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According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 6 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday; June 7, 2020. Topsoil moisture supplies were 10 percent short, 84 percent adequate and 6 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 6 percent short, 89 percent adequate, and 5 percent surplus. Pasture conditions were 100 percent good.
