According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 6 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday; June 14, 2020. Topsoil moisture supplies were 10 percent short, 87 percent adequate and 3 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 4 percent short, 94 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. Pasture conditions were 8 percent fair, 84 percent good and 8 percent excellent.
