According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday; July 12, 2020. Topsoil moisture supplies were 9 percent very short, 27 percent short, 63 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 32 percent short, and 68 percent adequate. Pasture conditions were 24 percent fair, and 76 percent good.
