According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 7 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday; July 19, 2020. Topsoil moisture supplies were 21 percent short and 79 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supplies were 15 percent short, and 85 percent adequate. Pasture conditions were 21 percent fair, and 79 percent good.
