According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 6.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday; July 26, 2020. Topsoil moisture supplies were 44 percent short and 56 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supplies were 29 percent short, and 71 percent adequate. Pasture conditions were 43 percent fair, and 57 percent good.
