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According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 6 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, October 25, 2020. Topsoil moisture supplies were 3 percent short, 91 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 3 percent short, 87 percent adequate, and 10 percent surplus. Pasture conditions were 2 percent poor, 17 percent fair, and 81 percent good.

Apples are light due to spring frost. Cooler nights are helping in the development of color. Storage apples & cider available through Christmas.
