According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 7 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, September 19, 2021. Topsoil moisture supplies were 14 percent short and 86 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supplies were 100 percent adequate. Pasture conditions were 4 percent poor, 10 percent fair, 86 percent good.
