According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 6 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, May 29, 2022. Topsoil moisture supplies were 88 percent adequate and 12 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 82 percent adequate and 18 percent surplus. Pasture conditions were 6 percent fair, 88 percent good and 6 percent excellent.
