According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 6 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, June 5, 2022. Topsoil moisture supplies were 91 percent adequate and 9 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 85 percent adequate and 15 percent surplus. Pasture conditions were 4 percent fair, 87 percent good and 9 percent excellent.
