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According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 7 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, June 19, 2022. Topsoil moisture supplies were 96 percent adequate and 4 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 4 percent short, 95 percent adequate and 1 percent surplus. Pasture conditions were 2 percent fair and 98 percent good.
