According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 6.0 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, July 10, 2022. Topsoil moisture supplies were 16 percent very short, 16 percent short and 84 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supplies were 19 percent short and 81 percent adequate. Pasture conditions were 4 percent poor, 9 percent fair and 87 percent good.

Plus, we also have light supplies of flat peaches. Forecast: Increasing volume of yellow fleshed peach varieties such as July Rose and Gala
