According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 5.0 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, May 7, 2023. Topsoil moisture supplies were 52 percent adequate and 48 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 50 percent adequate and 50 percent surplus. Pasture conditions were 80 percent good and 20 percent excellent.
