According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 7.0 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, June 4, 2023. Topsoil moisture supplies were 35 percent short and 65 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supplies were 32 percent short and 68 percent adequate. Pasture conditions were 5 percent short, 19 percent fair, and 71 percent good, and 5 percent excellent.
