According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 4 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, May 25, 2025. Topsoil moisture supplies were 9 percent short, 78 percent adequate, and 13 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 100 percent adequate. Pasture conditions were 13 percent poor, 20 percent fair, and 67 percent good.
